

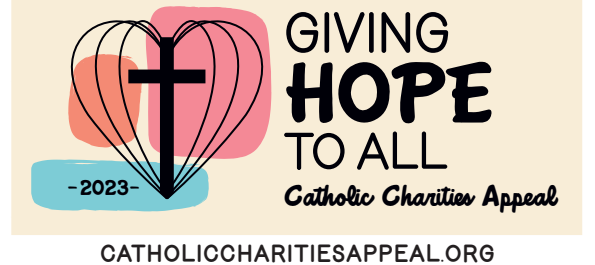
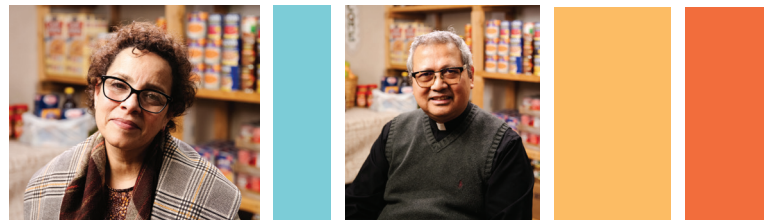
LOCAL MISSION ACTIVITIES

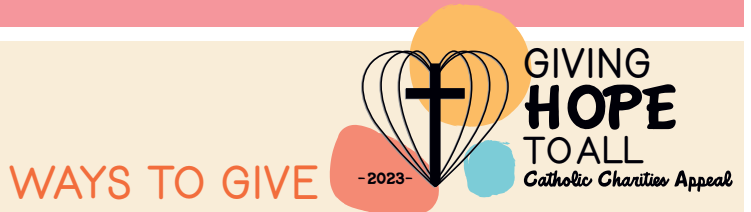
OUR BENEFICIARIES
